


Bure Classic 22'6"

The Bure Classic is the first of the traditional broads AUX sailing yachts to be known as the classics. Its lively performance will be appreciated by both novice and experienced yachtsmen, who want the best in Broads Sailing.



The Bure Classic has a Yanmar diesel engine situated in the forepeak, giving space and quietness in the cockpit and good cruising performance. This boat has a Fibreglass hull with a traditional wooden superstructure a spacious light interior and 6 foot of standing headroom aft with the roof raised. There are 2 berths (single or double) and an additional mattress for an extra berth in the cockpit if required. The galley is furnished with a two ring hob, oven and grill, sink, a full inventory of crockery and electric lights. The Bure Classic also has a toilet and razor point for your onboard cruising comfort.



The Womack Classic is a traditional broads AUX sailing yacht for all the family. Its lively performance will be appreciated by both novice and experienced yachtsmen alike, who want the best in Broads Sailing.

The Womack Classic has a Yanmar diesel engine situated in the forepeak providing good cruising performance, leaving the cockpit quiet for your enjoyment. This boat has a Fibreglass hull with a traditional wooden superstructure and a spacious light interior, with sleeping accommodation for 4/5 persons. There are 2 single berths in the forecabin; a double berth in the main cabin and an additional mattress for an extra berth in the cockpit. The galley is furnished with a two ring hob, oven and grill, a sink with electrically pumped hot and cold water, a full inventory of crockery, electric cool box and electric lights. The Womack Classic also has a separate toilet compartment with a wash basin and razor point. The hydraulically elevating roof gives 6'2" of standing head room throughout Engine the main cabin, galley and toilet compartment.


About us



How to find us



FROM NORWICH:

Take the A1151 from Norwich. Follow the signs to Wroxham, once over the river bridge, and through the busy Shopping area of Hoveton, you arrive at the mini roundabouts, turn right here onto the A1062 to Horning and Ludham. Follow this road to Ludham and drive through the village taking the first right into Horsefen Road towards Womack Staithe. Swallowtail Boatyard is on the right, at the end of Horsefen Road, where a warm welcome awaits you.

FROM GREAT YARMOUTH:

Take the A149 North, signposted to Caister and Stalham. At Potter Heigham turn left on to the A1062. At Ludham turn left into Horsefen Road signposted Womack Staithe, follow this road to the end, Swallowtail Boatyard is on the right, where you
